

# SCHOOL PROFILE

Established on Long Island by the Franciscan Brothers in 1933, Saint Anthony's High School continues an 800 year old Franciscan tradition of excellence in education. We are a private, Roman Catholic, co-educational, college preparatory school for students in grades 9 - 12 located in the suburban community of South Huntington, New York. Our school is a true representation of the ethnic and socioeconomic diversity of Long Island, as our students travel from over 100 school districts between Manhattan and Montauk.

Admission is selective and based upon the results of the Catholic High School Entrance Examination administered to 8th grade students. Students who achieve above average test scores, demonstrate the ability to succeed in a competitive college preparatory environment, and show a strong desire to attend Saint Anthony's receive admittance. Approximately 600 students are enrolled from the 1800 applicants. All students are required to complete a New York State Regents academic program.

Founded upon the Franciscan principle, "Capture the heart and the mind will follow", Saint Anthony's encourages young men and women to nurture their moral, intellectual, aesthetic, and physical faculties in an atmosphere of faith, respect, and encouragement. These principles foster an awareness of personal sanctification and good citizenship for which each person is created and in which each as an adult will share.

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#### GRADING SYSTEM

Saint Anthony's is a highly competitive high school. Students must maintain a 75 average in all courses. Students whose final grade average in a course is below 75 must attend summer school and earn a 75 or better to return to Saint Anthony's. Any student who fails more than three courses in one year will not be permitted to return for the following academic year.

#### NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Sophomore, junior and senior students with a cumulative average of 89.5% or above, who have presented concrete evidence that they possess good character and leadership qualities, and who have given service to the school and community, are eligible to apply for admission to the *Brother Robert Gabriel Alvernian* Chapter of the National Honor Society. Selections are made by a faculty committee.

#### **Uniforms**

Sophomore and Freshman Boys: Black uniform slacks, worn at waist-level, Gray uniform blazer, with embroidered school emblem, either long or short-sleeved, white oxford, button-down uniform shirt, fully tucked into the slacks, with cuffs, neck and collar buttoned, uniform black and gold patterned tie, uniform black belt, black socks only, and White Cross black uniform shoes only. In winter months, black sweater vest is worn under blazer.

Sophomore and Freshman Girls: Black knife-pleated uniform skirt, worn to cover the knee, Gray uniform blazer, with the embroidered school emblem, white 3/4 length sleeve hemmed uniform blouse. White Cross black uniform shoes only. Black tights are required when blazers are worn. In winter months, black sweater vest is worn under blazer.

In 2024-2025, tuition is \$12,550.00. Scholarships are academic based only and are awarded to registered students. There are no athletic scholarships given at Saint Anthony's.
